5. Who are the "bad girls" at Georgia's school? Why are they described as such? What is Georgia's relationship with these two girls when they are first introduced? Why?

6. Do you think Georgia's relationship with the "bad girls" in her school will change? Why or why not?

7. How might Georgia alter her relationship with them? What might make her choose to do so? What would the results be?
