- 2. Come up with at least 2 literal, 2 inferential and 2 evaluative questions you could ask about this poem.
- 3. After reading "My Fluorescent Flow", answer the following:
  - a) Create two evaluative questions that can be asked about this poem and answer them.
  - b) Why might poetry need more inferential questions to help your understanding of poems?
  - c) Does the author have an obvious "point of view" or perspective in the poem?
  - d) What conclusion does the poet make about Edison? Can she prove that conclusion? Do you agree with it?
- 4. Reread both poems and answer the following:
  - a) Do you think the poets have the same or different opinions of Thomas Edison? Explain.
  - b) What poetic devices or techniques did the poets use in their poems? Provide examples for each poem.
